NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: I KINGS 19:4-8

Queen Jezebel had vowed to kill Elijah, who went into the desert and prayed for death. Instead he went to sleep and was awakened by an angel, who told him to eat the food God had given him. He ate and went back to sleep, but God's angel again woke him and told him to eat. Strengthened by the food, he got up and walked forty days and nights to the mountain of God.

SECOND READING: EPHESIANS 4:30-5:2

Paul appeals to the Ephesians to get rid of bitterness, anger, and malice. Instead they must be kind, compassionate, and forgiving just as God has been. We must be imitators of Christ, and love one another as he has loved us.

GOSPEL: JOHN 6:41-51

The Jews were not convinced that Jesus was the bread that came down from heaven. But he again explains that he is the bread of life. He tells them that anyone who believes and eats this bread shall live forever. He explains that the bread he will give is his flesh, for the life of the world.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

Over the next three Sundays, the 19th, 20th, and 21st in Ordinary Time ,we will be treated in John's Gospel the heart of the Catholic message on the Eucharist. Jesus will testify that the Eucharist is His Body and Blood and that we are to consume it and to be transformed by it. He does not nuance His words and He realizes that it is through the gift of faith



that we will come to believe and accept. This gift of faith is a relationship with Him. Relationships always have the need to communicate with one another. If we do not pray, we will be denying ourselves an essential element of our union with Christ. Our relationship with people often develops over food and the sharing of our lives. We reveal ourselves and likewise the other person reveals themselves to us. We trust their word to be true and we put our faith in the person. If we find them to be dishonest with us, we feel betrayed and our relationship takes a step back. Jesus is always honest; he never shades the truth and acknowledges that believing in Him will be a challenge. Many of His disciples walked away in light of His teaching on the Eucharist. Many others, like ourselves, have been strengthened and commit ourselves to Christ and His Church. If there is ever a reason to question Christ and His Church we need to spend extra time in prayer and reflection receiving the Bread of Life. We must be seekers of the Truth. We need to use the tools of faith to seek understanding and know that the Lord will never deny us.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



HELENA

circa 255 - 330

FEAST AUGUST 18

Helena was the mother of Constantine, the Roman emperor who in 313 ended the persecution of Christians throughout the empire. She was born in Asia Minor, married a Roman general named Constantius Chlorus, and gave birth to Constantine in 274 in what is now Serbia. She became a Christian in 312, and thereafter was known for her devotion, prayerfulness and generosity to the poor. In about 326, she went to the Holy Land, where she spent her last years humbly doing the housework in her convent but also building churches on holy sites. She reportedly found the "true cross" of Calvary.
