FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

SECOND READING: PHILIPPIANS 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

GOSPEL: JOHN 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We are quickly approaching Holy Week and the Easter season. It is never too late to turn to the Lord and our Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, John 8:1-11, gives us a perfect example of the mercy of God.

The event of the woman accused of adultery gives the Lord the opportunity to teach us that we are not to judge one another and that each of us is in need of the mercy of God. It is often easy for people to see the faults of others and not their own sins. Jesus tells us that He has not come to condemn us but to save us. This is the reason that once our sins are known we must accept the grace of God and refrain from repeating these sins. The grace of God is sufficient for us.

Why do we fall back into the same sins? For some, the sin has become a habit and we find false comfort with our sin. For others, even though God grants us forgiveness we do not accept His mercy and rely only on our own will to overcome sin. Some say that Jesus was writing down the sins of those who were accusing the woman of adultery and that is why they walked away from Jesus and the woman. My hope is that they were also walking away from their sin of being judgmental.

With God's grace, all things are possible. We do not need to fear our God but to submit our will to His and know His never-ending blessings and His desire for us to be one with Him.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



ISIDORE OF SEVILLE

c. 565 - 636

FEAST APRIL 4

This bishop's extensive writings influenced church thinking for a millennium. As bishop of Seville, Spain, from about 600 until his death, he presided over two councils, promoted acceptance of the "filioque" clause of the Creed, and battled the Arian heresy. He wrote a history of the barbarian invasions of Spain and compiled in "The Etymologiae" all that was known in his time. Nearing death, he gave away everything he had, confessed his faults to his people in church, and received Communion. Pope John XXIII admired his ideas about the ideal bishop, notably that "Every bishop should be distinguished as much by his humility as by his authority." A doctor of the church, Isidore is the patron saint of computer users.

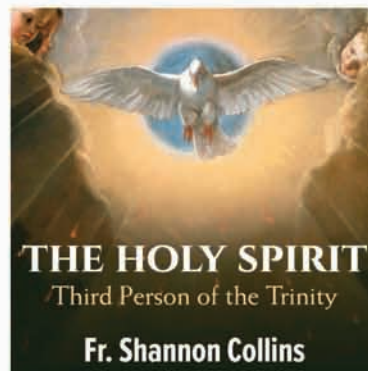

The Gospel of Salvation

Paul's letter to the Romans has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and controversy from the very beginning. Indeed, many Catholics fear that Romans is too "Protestant." But understood correctly, as St. Paul intended, Romans is authentically Catholic.

Romans reveals that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict; it is about entering into Christ's life, death, and resurrection and sharing in his divine life. In Jesus Christ all the hopes and expectations of Israel are fulfilled, leading to the universal family of God. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* is a new eight-week Bible study we are offering that will help you make sense of the difficult passages regarding faith, works of the law, and justification.
