FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

FIRST READING: ACTS 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas addressed many people, and large crowds gathered to hear them. Some of the Jews became jealous, and argued with whatever Paul said. But Paul and Barnabas continued preaching their message of salvation and everlasting life, until they were eventually forced to leave the town.

SECOND READING: REVELATION 7:9, 14b-17

John saw a vision of many people surrounding a throne and the Lamb. One of the elders told him these were the people who had survived great periods of trial, but maintained strong faith in God. Now they would receive eternal protection and comfort from God as reward for their loyalty.

GOSPEL: JOHN 10:27-30

Jesus states that his sheep know his voice and follow him, and will receive eternal life. Jesus also says that no one can snatch his followers away, because God is greater than anyone who might try, and Jesus is one with God.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

If you follow Bishop Robert Barron on his YouTube channel, you will already know that he is reflecting on the Book of Revelation, which we are reading during the Easter season as our second reading on the Sundays of Easter. These past Sundays we have the image of the Lamb who will shepherd and protect the people who have washed their clothes in the Blood of the Lamb. This image signifies Jesus Christ, Lamb of God, who was sacrificed for the remissions of sins for all people.



In our Church, we have mosaic of the Lamb over the entrance of our small chapel with our statues of Mary and Joseph along with a crucifix and votive candles. Originally, the Blessed Sacrament was reserved in this chapel. You also see in this mosaic a large Host and Chalice. It is worthwhile to pause and reflect on these images and allow the Lord to draw us up into His presence in the Heavenly Kingdom. So much of our lives are spent thinking about what we do here on earth and only earthly things, but we are made for eternity and a full life with the Lord in Heaven.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



SAINT DAMIEN DE VEUSTER

1840-1889

Feast Day—May 10

Born in Tremelo, Belgium, Joseph de Veuster left school at 13 to work on the family farm. Six years later he joined the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, taking the name Damien. He volunteered for a mission to the Hawaiian Islands and was ordained in Honolulu in 1864. He served on the island of Hawaii for eight years, then volunteered in 1873 to work at the leprosy colony on Molokai (leprosy is now called Hansen's disease). Father Damien was priest, doctor and counselor to 800 patients before he contracted the disease in 1884. He stayed on Molokai, ministering until a month before his death. Considered a model and martyr of charity, he was canonized in 2009.

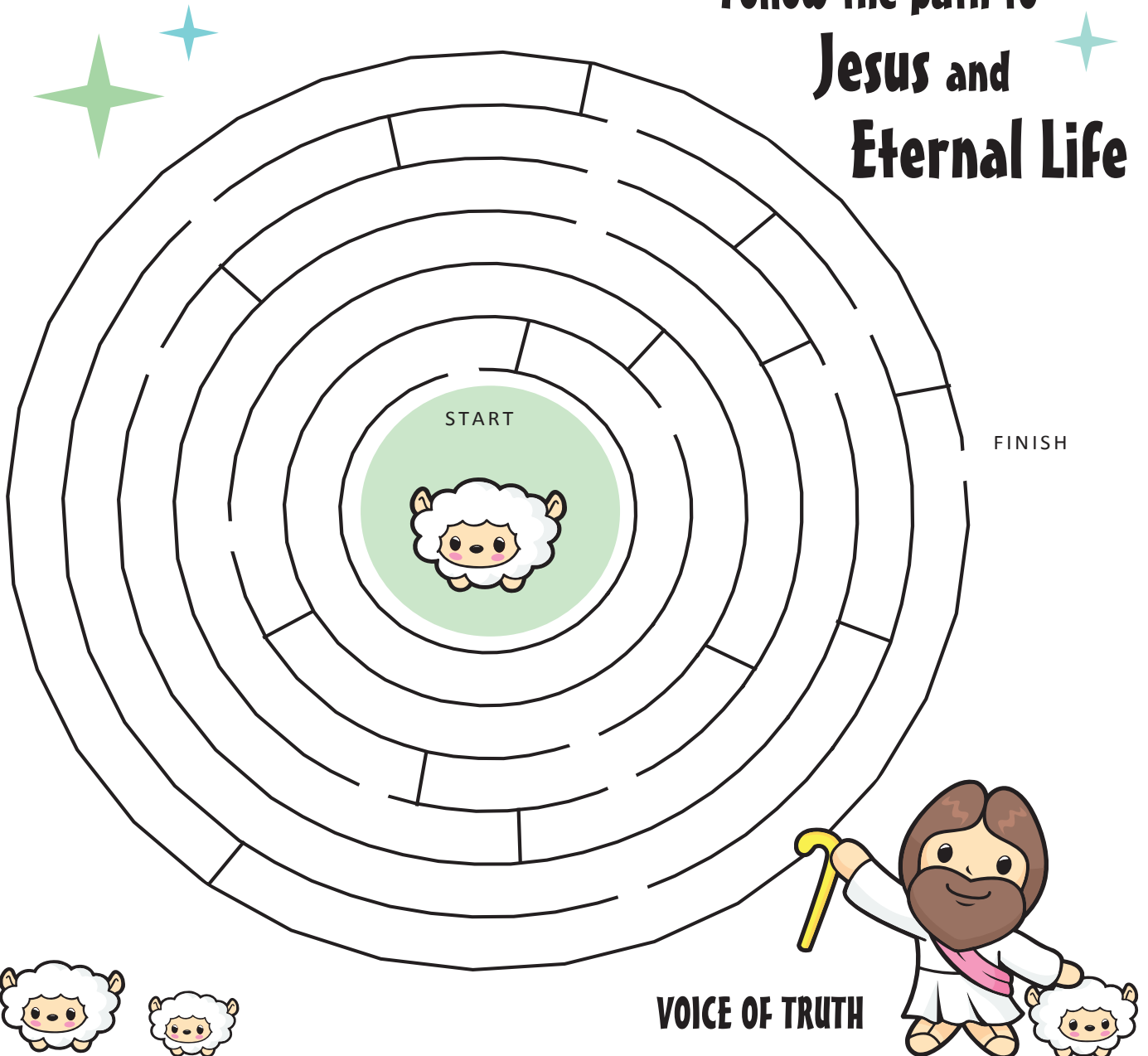
