CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the pa rish office.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In light of the Coronavirus news the Archdiocese of Washington and Annunciation wish to offer you some directives. These were announced at all the Masses last weekend.

No one is ever under any obligation to shake hands during the Sign of Peace (a slight bow or other gesture is appropriate) or to receive from the chalice.



Christ is fully present in each species when the bread and wine have been consecrated into His Body and Blood. I also wish to remind you, you may receive the Body of Christ in the hand instead of on the tongue. It may become prudent at a future time to discontinue - temporarily - the practice of offering communion under the form of the Precious Blood, as well as to take other precautions as necessary. We are looking to install hand Sanitizer Stations in the Church and restrooms.

Further, anyone who is ill, or suspects he or she is ill, should refrain from receiving from the chalice out of good will, or if warranted, refrain from participation in public activities, including Mass. If you need to refrain from Sunday Mass, due to illness, you are dispensed from the Sunday obligation.

In the future there may be more communication on this topic. We will monitor the news coming from the Centers for Disease Control and instructions from the Archdiocese of Washington. Please pray for all infected with this disease and those who are working for a cure.

On the Second Sunday of Lent we always read accounts of the Transfiguration. This is good for us to do. Our Lenten sacrifices may become more difficult to endure and we need to know that they will assist us in turning to the Lord and seeking His will not only for this world but also for the life to come. As Jesus strengthened his Disciples He also looks to strengthen us. He will never abandon us to the powers and trials of this world but will lead us to Eternal Life.

Luigi Orione

1872 - 1940

FEAST MARCH 12

The founder of The Little Work of Divine Providence, which encompasses two active and two contemplative religious orders for men and women as well as a lay movement, was born in Italy's Piedmont. After early sojourns with Franciscans and Salesians, he entered the seminary of the Diocese of Tortona and was ordained in 1895. Always devoted to the care of others, especially the poor and sick, Don Orione established schools and learning centers, worker hostels, hospitals, and homes for the elderly, disabled, sick and blind. The members of his apostolate serve today in 300 foundations in Europe, Asia, Africa and North and South America. The dying words of this priest, who was canonized in 2004, were "Jesus... Jesus... Jesus."

KEEP PRAYING FOR OUR SEMINARIANS

Thanks to all of you who picked a card from the Vocations Tree. Please keep up the daily prayers for seminarians throughout Lent -- and beyond, if you wish. By the way, did you notice each seminarian's card lists his year of formation? Did you wonder what it meant? Archdiocesan seminarians go through many years of formation before ordination! Seminarians who have just graduated from high school work on earn-



ing a bachelor's degree in philosophy (First College, Second College, Third College, Fourth College). Then they go on to study graduate-level theology (First Theology, Second Theology, Third Theology, Fourth Theology). Men who have already earned a bachelor's degree before coming to the seminary may need to spend 2 years in a pre-theology program before going on to graduate-level theology (First Pre-Theology, Second Pre-Theology). At some point before ordination, a seminarian may spend a year at a parish (Pastoral Year). Usually a seminarian is ordained a transitional deacon the year before he is ordained a priest. If you picked a deacon, pray for him a special way: He is preparing for ordination in June!
