THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Moses reminds the Israelites that when they were starving in the desert, the Lord fed them with "manna" - a food not known to them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul points out to the Corinthians that through the sharing of the cup and the breaking of the bread, they are all one in Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL: JOHN 6:51-58

After Jesus feeds the five thousand people with barley loaves and fishes, he tries to make them understand the significance and the meaning of what he has done. He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, "I myself am the living bread... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever."

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.



Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

First, I would like to pass onto you words from Fr. Jack:

Dear Parishioners of Annunciation,

I want to personally thank Fr. Jack for his fraternal priestly friendship and with all of you wish him well in this new assignment. As we may not be able to gather to have a large farewell sendoff, let us find other ways, starting with our prayers, to express our thankfulness and best wishes.

Second, please remember that this Sunday, June 14 we will have a parish-wide food drive from 9 AM to 12 PM to assist the many people who have suffered a lack of nourishment due to financial situations that have been very difficult. Please bring your donations to the upper parking lot by way of Massachusetts Avenue. If you are not able to drop off food you may provide a grocery store gift card. This is our first parish-wide social concerns event since the virus, and we want to make it a success. If you are able and comfortable doing so, please participate.

We live not only in interesting times but also in uncertain times. We are getting asked over and over, when can I come to Mass again? Right now, we are limited to no more than 10 people at Mass including the priest, deacon, cantor and organist. That leaves space for 6 people on Sunday. How am I to decide which 6? As I wrote to you before, we have applied for a waiver of this rule but have not heard back from the government. Starting Monday June 15, we resume our daily Mass at 8 am and 11 am. There can only be 10 people as of now. If we exceed this number, we may put our waiver in jeopardy, and that is something no one wants.

I know it is for all of our good that this limitation has been imposed upon us. I have created a document that indicates what we should all expect at the time of reopening. You will find this document on our website. Once we are able to have more than 10 people we will set up a signup process to track how people will attend Mass.

The dispensation by Archbishop Gregory for attending Mass is still in effect. Please follow us with our livestreaming Mass on Sundays. If you are in the vulnerable category due to underlying health conditions, have been exposed to the Covid 19 virus, have cared for someone who had the virus, or have been in large crowds, you should refrain from Mass or volunteering to assist at Mass, or putting yourself or anyone else in danger. I know this is a hardship, but it is for all of our good. The virtue of prudence should guide us.

The guidelines we have developed so far are available in the Mass Opening Procedures. They are subject to change once we get an opportunity to evaluate their function in practice. I hope these cover most of our experience but I am sure other questions will develop.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Juliana of Falconieri

1270-1341

FEAST JUNE 19

Juliana was the only child of a wealthy couple in Florence, Italy, who had built the church of the Annunciation there. She refused to marry and was enrolled as a tertiary with the Servite order; her uncle, St. Alexis Falconieri, was one of the seven founders of the Servites. For nearly 20 years, Juliana lived a devout and useful life at home. In 1304 she formed a community of tertiary sisters who devoted themselves to prayer and good works in Florence. She is considered the foundress of the Servite community of nuns, and was canonized in 1737.
