Pentecost Sunday

FIRST READING: ACTS 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

One of the blessings I've have experienced here at Annunciation is knowing the commitment this parish has made to support a medical clinic in Honduras. Along with several other parishes, St. Paul's Damascus, Pius X Bowie, St. Peter's Olney, and Our Lady Help of Christians, Silver Spring, tremendous good has been accomplished. Many of the people from the villages look forward to the care and the visits by doctors, nurses and parishioners who travel there several



times a year. Annunciation has contributed to the clinic for a couple of years donating \$4,800.00 per year. Much of this money has been used to provide over the counter drugs and medical supplies. Even with such a large donation the needs far out way the capacity of the parishes involved. They are now working on grant proposals from Non-Governmental Organizations. There are also opportunities for our parishioners to make a trip to the clinic and assist the people directly. May we always trust in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Anthony of Padua

1195 - 1231

FEAST JUNE 13

This doctor of the church was born in Lisbon, Portugal, and joined the Augustinians at age 15. In 1220 he entered the Franciscans to become an African missionary and was sent to Morocco. However, poor health forced his return to Europe and a storm at sea deposited him in Sicily. He traveled to Assisi, where his gift for preaching was recognized and put to use in Italy and France. St. Francis appointed him the order's first "lector in theology"; he also was the superior of several communities. Many believers seek his intercession when something is lost.

THE NORTHWEST CENTER

Kelly Marcum from the Northwest Center will be available to meet with parishioners after the 7:30, 9:00, 10:30, 12:30 Masses on Sunday, June 9th. She will be distributing materials about the services offered by the Center, and accepting financial and material donations (gently used infant clothing and supplies).

Founded in 1981, the Northwest Center is one of only two prolife pregnancy centers in DC and has served more than 57,300 women and children in the Washington area through its pregnancy center and maternity home, which provides safe housing for pregnant women facing homelessness. The Northwest Center's mission is to support pregnant and parenting women in need, to act on its belief in the intrinsic value and dignity of all human life, and to provide new beginnings for pregnant or parenting women. The Center's programs are designed to help women and men effectuate real change in their lives for the sake of their children and families, with the ultimate goal of achieving self-sufficiency. In 2018, their pregnancy center assisted more than 1,035 mothers, fathers, and children and their maternity home housed 4 women and 4 babies. ST PAUL HONDURAS CLINIC SUPPLY DRIVE

The St. Paul Honduras Clinic opened in April 1999 in response to relief efforts after Hurricane Mitch. It serves hundreds of families from eight communities near the capital city of Tegucigalpa. The Clinic provides medical and dental care and is one of the only clinics in Honduras to provide medical care to AIDs patients. It also regularly reaches out to remote areas of the country to provide medical care to those who have less than they do. 




The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit were promised by Christ and are made known to us by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation.
