FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

SECOND READING: COLOSSIANS 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Increasingly over the years, we have seen a greater division among people. It has shown itself in the vulgar and harsh language that is directed toward others, a quicker response to resort to violence when differences occur, and a greater disregard for the life and wellbeing of strangers and acquaintances. Pope Saint John Paul II has labeled it the "culture of death". One of the reasons this is happening is the propensity



to see oneself as greater than the other. My needs, desires, and self are more important than that of someone else.

Jesus confronts this attitude in the parable of the Good Samaritan, Luke 10:25-37. The Jews at the time of Jesus saw Samaritans as outcasts. There was no need to be attentive to their good, and it was acceptable to even ignore them or treat them with disdain. As the priest and Levi pass by the man on the road who was the victim of violence and robbery, they put their own cultural and religious purity ahead of reaching out to another in need. Jesus sees the Samaritan as one who goes beyond religious and cultural differences to assist the Jewish victim who would probably not treat him with the same respect.

Luke calls us to follow Jesus' love of God and neighbor. Luke does not place these commandments as one greater than the other, but see equal value in both of them. It may be good for us to start to think and act similarly. May we begin with our family first and then extend this attitude within our community and members of our country.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



KATERI TEKAKWITHA 1656-1680 FEAST JULY 14

At her canonization in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI prayed, "St. Kateri, protectress of Canada and the first Native American saint, we entrust to you the renewal of the faith in the First Nations and in all of North America!" The daughter of a Mohawk chief and Algonquin woman, Kateri was orphaned in a smallpox epidemic that left her partly blind and disfigured. She was baptized by a French missionary visiting her village in New York state. But, her faith and refusal to marry caused trouble, and she fled to an Indian community near Montreal, where she was revered by French and Indians alike for her mystical gifts and kindness. The "Lily of the Mohawk" is the patron of Native Americans, refugees and the disabled.

Annunciation Parish Council Minutes

The meeting opened with prayer on June 28 at 7:04pm. Monsignor Mellone, Joe, John, Art, and Tom attended.

The school had a table at Glover Park Day, but with limited presence due to the day coinciding with ACS graduation. Future iterations may need more parishioner presence to balance this, as this is when the ACS graduation tends to be.

The building leak remains unsolved as of this morning.

We are seeking a timeline for the completion of the carillon, aiming for end of August. We will need confidence in the date if the Cardinal is to bless the addition and the carillon shortly after.

Father Grzegorz has left for his new parish. Father Adam Park, returned from Rome, will be doing some Masses at Annunciation.

Joe trimmed the bushes blocking the sign in front of the church. David will be assessing the wiring for lighting possibilities; the Church will also evaluate getting a new sign.

Tom suggested an Advent event, perhaps a week or so before Christmas, with a short, liturgy-like set of readings and songs in the darkened church, and perhaps the blessing of the creche, followed by a procession into the parish hall for cookies, punch, and carols.

The Council will next meet September 27th.

The meeting closed with prayer at 7:39pm.




