The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

•are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist

•were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

•were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

Children's CCD

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.



We devote significant resources to our Learning Center which serves as a tool to empower our scholars to grow academically and our teachers to grow in both skill and practice.

As a resource for scholars, faculty and parents, the Learning Center's team of highly qualified educators, is committed to guide students and their parents through assessing student individual needs, overseeing the referral and external diagnostic processes. Our team provides support to ensure the success of our scholars in content areas preparing them for high school and beyond. The Learning Center oversees the administration of CAP and ICEP plans.

Support is provided on an individual basis as suggested from a scholar's formal evaluation. Teachers participate in ongoing collaboration opportunities with the Learning Center Team to ensure the adherence to a student's accommodation profile.

Our team supports the middle school scholars in the areas of self-management and executive functioning. Our team also supports the transitions from elementary to middle school and middle school to high school schoolwide.


The Triumph of the Immaculate Heart
